Safety Tips



Anyone in your golf cart should keep their arms and legs inside the vehicle at all times.



There should never be more people in your cart than there are seats for.



You are subject to the same traffic laws as a typical passenger car. Obey the laws at all times.



Distracted driving is the number one cause of motor vehicle accidents. Focus on the road.



Don't drive your cart with anyone standing or sitting on the back, side or front platforms.



If you stop off to have a drink, don't operate your cart. You could be arrested for drunk driving or injure someone.



Left hand turns are more hazardous than people believe. Check your blind spots, and use signals.



Drive at speeds that are right for the conditions, not only of the road you are on but for the weather as well.



Don't start, speed up or stop suddenly. Driving in a jerky motion is hazardous for your passengers and others on the road.



If you leave your golf cart, make sure to take your keys with you to avoid anyone from driving it who's unauthorized to do so.



Keep an eye on the weather before you decide to head out in your cart. Avoid driving during thunderstorms.



When you are operating your golf cart, always yield to pedestrians, who almost always have right of way.
